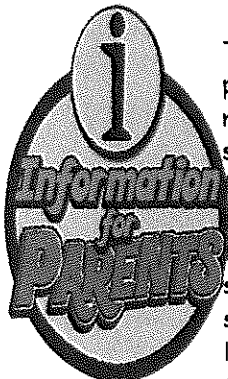
Nurse Notes

As everyone knows, Flu Season is upon us. Flu season starts in October and ends in May. New York State recommends everyone, 6 months of age and older, should receive their yearly Flu vaccine by the end of October. This will help protect your child from getting the Flu. Anyone who has direct contact with children should also receive a Flu vaccine. In addition to getting the season Flu vaccine, you can take everyday preventative actions to stay "Flu-free." These actions include staying away from others who may be sick, washing your hands to reduce the spread of germs, and if you are sick with the Flu-stay home from work or school. This will help prevent the spread of the Flu to others.

Notes from Dr. Beckles, NE School Psychologist:



This school year may be your child's first experience in a formal education environment. They, as well as you, may be experiencing some separation anxiety! Your child may be fearful that you will not be home at some point after they return from school or that something will happen to you in their absence. Reassure your child daily that he or she is going to a safe place, to meet and make new friends, to learn new and fun things, that you will be able to talk about their day every day at home and that you will see them later.
